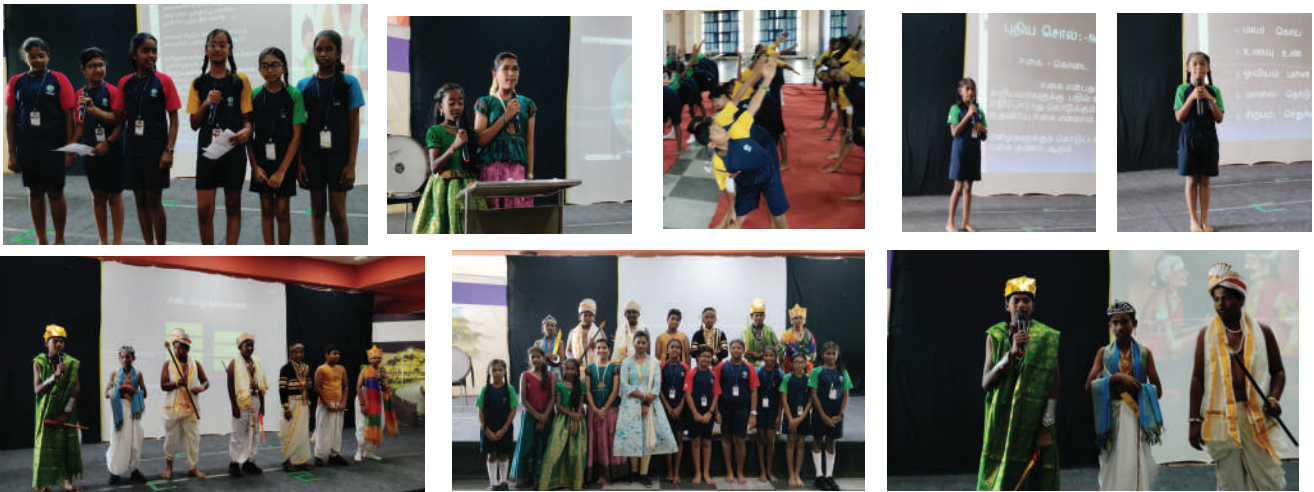

Elocution Competition

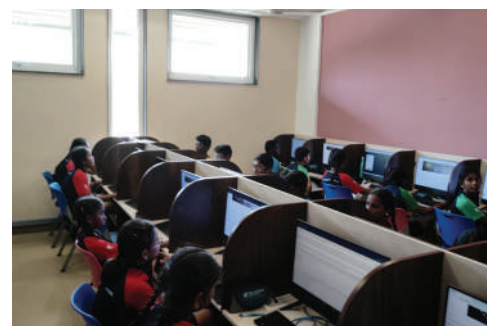

SAFAL

Structured Assessment for Analyzing Learning (SAFAL), a competency-based assessment for Grades 6 and 9 was conducted from 22-07-2024 to 05-08-2024 to assess the foundational skills and basic learning outcomes among students.



It comprises of core concepts along with relevant higher-order skills and application of knowledge in real-life situations, rather than rote memorization. SAFAL, as a diagnostic assessment, will provide developmental feedback to schools and teachers to improve teaching-learning without additional examination pressure on students.

It has been designed to help students, and teachers to track their learning progress. Students felt that the questions they attended were moderate and it acts as a testing tool for their pre knowledge.

Educational Visit To District Science Center

On the 12th of August 2024, a group of 80 students, accompanied by 6 teachers, visited the District Science Center in Vellore. The visit began at 10:00 am, marking the start of an enriching educational experience. The primary goal of visiting the science center was to educate students through experiential learning.

The visit was aimed to broaden their scientific knowledge, encourage exploration and discovery, and make complex scientific concepts more accessible and understandable for young minds.

The center offered a wealth of knowledge across various scientific fields. The visit began at the Physical Science Gallery, located on the ground floor, where students were introduced to fundamental concepts in physics. The students collectively secured 5 A*, 2 A, and 1 B, a testament to their dedication and perseverance.

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Professional Development Session

Mr.Senthil, our Cambridge coordinator has attended the Cambridge Academic Support Workshop held at Hindustan International School, Coimbatore, led by Ms. Alkay Pandey on 10th August, 2024. The workshop provided an in-depth exploration of the Cambridge teaching-learning philosophy, focusing on the Curriculum-Pedagogy-Assessment Cycle. Participants were introduced to key approaches such as Active Learning, Assessment for Learning, Differentiated Learning, Effective Questioning, Effective Feedback, and Metacognition. These concepts were brought to life through modeling and discussions, making them relevant to classroom practices. Educators were encouraged to incorporate these strategies into their lesson plans, with resources from the School Support Hub linked to these approaches. The day concluded with a collaborative conversation, where attendees shared best practices and addressed their queries, fostering a supportive learning community.

Ms. Sathya attended a two-day Cambridge workshop on 'Cambridge International AS & A Level Physics (9702)' focused on assessment for the 2022-24 and 2025-27 syllabus, held in Mumbai, India, on 8th August, 2024. The hands-on sessions deepened her understanding of Cambridge's assessment criteria, particularly the importance of precise, significant figures in student responses. This experience has greatly enhanced her approach to providing constructive feedback and will positively impact her teaching



Tetra Session

On August 25, 2024, an online Tetra session on Classroom Management was conducted by Dr. Praseedha Sreekumar, engaging over 60 teachers. The session began with an emphasis on the importance of essential agreements and the do's and don'ts of effective classroom management. Teachers were divided into six groups within breakout rooms to discuss and deliberate on strategies that contribute to successful classroom teaching. Each group presented their consolidated points, highlighting key takeaways.

The session then transitioned to exploring the components of an effective classroom, including Learning Objectives, Lesson Objectives, Vocabulary, Prior Knowledge, and collaboratively intelligent activities. Differentiation, Assessment, Writing, and Reflection were also discussed as crucial elements. A deeper understanding was developed around the concepts of the Collaboratively Intelligent Activity, the Sandwich approach, and the distinctions between Learning and Lesson Objectives.

The session concluded with the powerful message, "It's the teacher that makes the difference, not the classroom." Teachers provided their insights and feedback through a shared form, marking the session as a valuable and reflective learning experience.

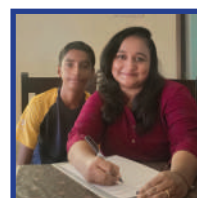
